ABSTRACT AND PROPOSAL REVIEW MECHANISM Scientific Symposium of the 19TH ICOMOS General Assembly


The Scientific Committee was pleased to receive 574 submissions in the form of Abstracts and Proposals with highly competitive entries for the four sub-themes of the Scientific Symposium.

The Symposium program allows for a limited number of papers to be selected for presentation. The shortlisting of ST01 Abstracts was most challenging due to the large number of exceptional entries received.

Abstracts for each sub-theme were blind reviewed by a panel of 47 national and international experts from ICOMOS (including IUCN, ICCROM for ST04), who worked on agreed criteria for selection of papers for presentation and some for poster submission.

Each Scientific Committee (ST01, ST02 and ST03) was divided into three groups of three Reviewers each. The total abstracts received for the sub-theme were distributed equally amongst the three Sub-Committees (for example: Scientific Committee for ST01 was divided into ST01A, ST01B and ST01C).

The task was hence divided into smaller groups and enabled each submitted abstract to be reviewed by three reviewers.

Keeping in view the global coverage of the Symposium and the sub-themes identified for discussion, the process of selection took the following factors into account:

- 1) **Expert Reviews**: Each paper was sent to a minimum of three reviewers who placed each abstract into the following Selection Categories
 - Accepted as Paper
 - Accepted with Minor Revisions
 - Accepted for Poster Submission
 - Not Accepted

Based on reviews received in each selection category, an order was allocated to each abstract.

2) Categories of Abstracts and the decision taken for each:

> Category 1: Selected for Paper

• 3 (Accepts) = Selected for Paper

> Category 2: Conditional Selection for Paper (CS)

- 2 (Accepts) + 1 (Minor Revision) = CS1
- 1 (Accept) + 2 (Minor Revisions) = CS2
- 2 (Accepts) + 1 (Poster Approval) = CS3
- 3 (Minor Revisions) = CS4
- 1 (Accept) + 1 (Minor Revision) + 1 (Poster Approval) = CS5
- 2 (Accepts) + 1 (Reject) = CS6 <
- 1 (Accept) + 1 (Minor Revision) + 1 (Reject) = CS7 ←
- 2 (Minor Revisions) + 1 (Poster Approval) = CS8
- 2 (Minor Revisions) + 1 (Reject) = CS9

Review of topics in the above categories was carried out based on order of value allocation, subject of paper and geographical location to take a final decision about their selection under paper or poster category or for putting them in waiting list.

- 2 (Rejects) + 1 (Minor Revision)
- 2 (Rejects) + 1 (Poster Approval)
- 3 (Rejects)

3) Relevance to the respective sub-theme:

A critical aspect of the selection process is the relevance or contribution of the proposed study to the respective sub-theme in which the abstract has been submitted. The final list was based on this factor, due to which some abstracts were moved between sub-themes.

4) Geographical Location of the Region/Community Groups covered in the abstract:

An objective of the Symposium is to achieve wide regional representation, to include diverse regions and communities in this dialogue at a global level. This was taken into account in the final decision making.

5) Marks Awarded:

Marks were awarded by reviewers on the following attributes:

- Relevance to Theme/ Adds value to current body of Knowledge (out of 06 marks)
- Key words and Subject/ Title (out of 02 marks)
- Clarity in Communication/ Language Skills (out of 02 marks)

Scientific Committee for ST04- Culture-Nature Journey (CNJ) comprised of a Task Force of Subject Experts from ICOMOS, IUCN and ICCROM guided by the sub-theme Co-Chairs. The call for proposals for STO4 was for Session Proposals rather than paper abstracts and required presubmission collaboration with a large resource group of IUCN and ICOMOS members whose role was to assist both in providing feedback on the ideas of potential contributors but also to assist in building the ICOMOS IUCN collaboration.

In addition to the sessions which addressed the call for CNJ submissions, the proposals received included a large number of paper abstracts that had not been through the above feedback and collaboration process.

Proposals for all session formats: Workshop/ Knowledge Café/ Case Study Kiosk/ Paper Presentation/ Poster were reviewed by the Co-Chairs and the Task Force. The individual paper abstracts submitted were reviewed and where possible, allocated to the agreed sessions and several sessions of related papers were created. In total 13 Workshops, 8 Knowledge Cafes, 4 Paper Sessions and 2 Case Study sessions were selected. Many Paper and Case Study submissions were offered poster opportunities.
